Refund & Cancellation Information – If Camp Chippewa cancels the event or the event is full, Camp Chippewa will process a full refund. If the participant cancels 10 days prior to the event date (9/15/10) you will receive a refund of all but the initial deposit (\$20.00). If the office is contacted within the 10 day period prior to the event, there will be no refund.

Some Information about the RIDE – No horse is needed, we will be using Chippewa stock, tack, helmets, and we even have boots so nothing to go out and purchase. **Do to the length of this ride it is not recommended for 1st time riders/beginners.** Our maximum number of riders for this event is 15 - This 3 hour session will include, a 45min./1hr. prep time (The more riders the more time this may take to complete): Collection of any Balance due, verification of release forms, Fitting of Boots, and Helmets, an Instructional/demonstration period, and arena testing for each participant. Wranglers will then select the horse for you, and assist in mounting, setting equipment to each rider. There are no stops along the way, this is a continuous ride guided by our Wrangler staff here at Camp Chippewa. We are excited to bring this second season opportunity to you, and prayerfully it will be in great demand, for us to schedule annually rides for the future here at Camp Chippewa.

Open Trail Ride – Policies & Guidelines for a Safe and Memorable Ride

- 1) Everyone must wear a smooth sole pull on boot with at least a 1-inch heel. Camp Chippewa has a small selection of used boots that you may borrow for the ride.
- 2) Everyone MUST wear long pants/jeans to protect your legs from trees and branches and rubbing against the saddle. Please, no dangly jewelry, long tailed shirts, or trousers that drag the ground.
- 3) Everyone MUST wear a helmet, which we provide. A Staff person will fit you accordingly. Helmets must be on before entering the gate to the corral, and stay on until you are back outside of the gate. The helmets are sprayed as often as possible with an insecticide to help in the prevention of lice. You are welcome to bring your own helmet, if you'd like (no Bike helmets, please).
- 4) For The Open Trail Rides riders must be 6th grade or older and pass the arena test to participate, **do to the length of this ride it is not recommended for 1st time riders/beginners.**
- 5) A person's physical fitness, build/frame is important in being able to maintain a good seat while on the horse. Our staff has the right to impose the 250 lb. weight limit. We reserve the right to deny admission to horseback activities if our staff is concerned with a person or group's safety, or the safety and well being of the animals.
- 6) A parent/ guardian or group leader must inform staff of any participant with any type of special needs prior to the activity, this could affect their ability to participate in this specific activity event (see above in the registration portion**)
- 7) No cell phones, cameras, video equipment, or headsets are allowed on the Trail Rides. Pictures can be taken after we return to the corral with the assistance of a Wrangler. Our H. Wrangler will be carrying a cell phone to follow our emergency procedures, and all Wranglers will small first aid kits if needed.
- 8) Horses will be in a single file line, riders will space themselves accordingly as not to tailgate other horses, and it is a Trail Ride so walking will be the gate. This will give you an opportunity to view and enjoy the beautiful camp grounds as the season starts changing from late summer to fall, it is an awesome time to see the camp.
- 9) Please be sure to complete both sides of this form, copy one for yourself to keep, and return this form along with payment to the camp office. Happy Trails!!



Camp Chippewa Horseback Riding Release Form

(Registration of Open Trail Ride, Policies & Guidelines for horseback riding are on the back of this form)

Please read both sides of this form carefully before signing. Camp Chippewa does not guarantee your safety; serious injury may result from participation in this activity.

I, the following listed individual hereinafter known as the "rider" and the parents or legal guardians thereof, if a minor, do hereby voluntarily request and agree to participate in horseback riding activities offered by Camp Chippewa.

This agreement shall be legally binding upon me the "rider," and the parents and/or the legal guardians thereof if a minor, my heirs, estate, assigns, including all minor children and personal representatives. The term " Camp" herein shall refer to Camp Chippewa. The term "horse" herein shall refer to all equine species. The term "Horseback Riding" herein shall refer to riding or otherwise handling of horses whether from the ground or mounted. The terms "I," "me," "my" shall herein refer to the above rider and the parents or legal guardians thereof if a minor.

I understand that this Camp chooses its horses for their calm disposition and sound basic training and that this Camp follows a rigid risk reduction program. Yet no horse is a completely safe horse. Any horse can, at any moment revert from its training and act on its natural instincts. These could include, but are not limited to, bucking, shying, rearing, biting, and/or bolting. Horseback riding is classified as a "rugged adventure sport activity," and there are numerous obvious and non-obvious risks always present in such an activity despite all the safety precautions. My participation in the activity may expose me to some of the following situations plus others too numerous to list: rough, slippery or wet terrain; public or private roadways; other riders, walkers or bikers; motorized and non-motorized vehicles; trees; brush; hillsides; domestic and wild animals; and sudden weather changes.

I agree that in consideration of this Camp allowing my participation in this activity, under the terms set forth herein, I, the rider, for myself and on behalf of my child and/or legal ward, heirs, administrators, personal representatives, or assigns, do agree to hold harmless release and discharge this Camp, its owner, agents, employees, officers, directors, representatives, assigns, members, owners of premises, insurers affiliated organizations, and others acting on its behalf, of and from all claims, demands, causes of action, legal liability, whether the same be known or unknown, anticipated or unanticipated, due to this Camp and/or its associates ordinary negligence; and I do further agree that except in the event of this Camp's gross negligence and willful and wanton misconduct, I shall not bring any claims, demands, legal actions, and causes of action, against this Camp and its associates as stated above in this clause, for any economic and non-economic losses due to bodily injury, death, property damage, sustained by me and/or my minor child or legal ward in relation to the premises and operation of this Camp, to include while riding, handling or otherwise being near horses owned by or in the care, custody and control of this Camp whether on or off the premises of this Camp.

Note: Under Kansas Law, there is no liability for an injury to or the death of a participant in domestic animal activities resulting from the inherent risks of domestic animal activities, pursuant to sections 1 through 4. You are assuming the risk of participating in the domestic animal activity.

(c) the contracts described in subsection (a) shall contain the following language: Inherent risks of domestic animal activities include, but shall not be limited to:

- (1) The propensity of a domestic animal to behave in ways i.e., running, bucking, biting, kicking, shying, stumbling, rearing, falling, or stepping on, that may result in an injury, harm or death to persons on or around them;
- (2) The unpredictability of a domestic animal's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals;
- (3) certain hazards such as surfaces and subsurface conditions;
- (4) Collision with other domestic animals or objects; and
- (5) the potential of a participant to act in negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the domestic animals or not acting within such participant's ability.
